



Plan for the Implementation of Common Core

Curtis Creek School District has been allocated \$94,000 from funds provided in Assembly Bill (AB) 86, Section 85 (Chapter 48, Statutes of 2013) to support the implementation of California Common Core Standards for the purpose of establishing high-quality instructional programs for all pupils. School districts receiving these funds may encumber the apportioned funds any time during the 2013–14 or 2014–15 fiscal years. As a condition of receiving these funds, the LEA must develop and adopt a plan delineating how funds shall be spent. The plan shall be explained in a public meeting of the Governing Board before its adoption in a subsequent public meeting.
